New Business – Steve spoke to the proposed changes in the zoning ordinance that is currently being reviewed, sauna setbacks from the water and private roads. After much discussion of reasons for setbacks, grey water, fixed vs portable, elevation, the ZBA asked that the proposed changes be brought to the October meeting.

Ann also spoke about applications from a contractor vs homeowner. Property owners may not understand the ordinance, and contractors believe everything is possible. A pre-application conference with the homeowner is recommended so they better understand the ordinance and the ramifications of building outside of the ordinance guidelines. Sanctions against contractors for past violations will carry forward.

The training session included side A or the zoning ordinance appeal flow chart. Everyone understands a variance for a USE is not permissible. A practical difficulty must always be found when granting a variance. We need to be cognizant of the potential to undermine the ordinance with the granting of a variance, when in fact, the applicant should seek to amend the ordinance through the Planning Commission. The members were provided a copy of the most current ZBA Variance Checklist. *To included* **as prepared by Eagle Harbor Township and considered by the County** *ZBA.*
