## OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS KEWEENAW COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS October 16, 2013

The regular monthly meeting of the Keweenaw County Board of Commissioners held October 16, 2013, 6:30 p.m. at the Courthouse, Eagle River, MI, opened with the pledge of allegiance.

Commissioners present: Frank Stubenrauch, Ray Chase, Don Piche, Del Rajala. Absent: Randy Eckloff.

The meeting was posted in the Courthouse on the bulletin board and the agenda for the meeting was posted on the door of the Courthouse.

Motion by Rajala supported by Chase and unanimously carried to approve the agenda as presented.

Motion by Chase supported by Rajala and unanimously carried to accept the minutes as presented from the September 18, 2013 board meeting.

The Treasurer, Sheriff and Mine Inspector reports were received.

Kim Stoker from WUPPDR presented material for a project called the Regional Prosperity Initiative. The Initiative is voluntary competitive grants process that is part of Governor Snyder's FY 2014 Executive Budget Recommendation to encourage local private, public and non-profit partners to create vibrant regional economies. Only existing Planning Development Regions are eligible to apply for the grants and funding will only be available to those that are collaborating and coordinating with many agencies. WUPPDR is interested in making a grant application and is asking for a resolution of support.

Don Kilpela spoke to the board about the economic impact that the Copper Harbor light display has for our area. He was asking for financial support after having unanimous support at the EDC meeting. Approximately 35 to 40 thousand lights are put up and in order to keep improving the display, more money is needed for lights and for replacement of some of the lights.

Time was allowed for public comment.

Motion by Rajala supported by Chase and unanimously carried to reappoint Joan Heikkila to the Board of Canvassers for a 4 year term, 11/1/13 through 10/31/17.

Motion by Stubenrauch supported by Rajala and unanimously carried to adopt the following resolution regarding the Keweenaw County 2013-2018 Hazard Mitigation Plan:

WHEREAS, Keweenaw County and its communities are at risk of natural, technological and societal hazards;

WHEREAS, the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 requires communities to have a five year Hazard Mitigation Plan approved by FEMA in order to receive funds available through certain mitigation grant programs; and WHEREAS, the Keweenaw County Hazard Mitigation Plan prepared by the Western Upper Peninsula Planning and Development Region, in cooperation with the Keweenaw Count Office of Emergency Management, identifies the hazard threats to the County and feasible mitigation projects to minimize hazard impacts; and WHEREAS, the contents of the Hazard Mitigation Plan were reviewed by and account for input from residents and local officials representing the local units of government within Keweenaw County.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Keweenaw County Board of Commissioners hereby adopts the Keweenaw County 2013-2018 Hazard Mitigation Plan. (#13-7)

Motion by Chase supported by Stubenrauch and unanimously carried to adopt the following resolution regarding an application to be submitted by WUPPDR for the Western U.P. Michigan Prosperity Region: WHEREAS, Governor Snyder and the Michigan Legislature have created the Regional Prosperity Initiative, and

WHEREAS, in 2012 the State of Michigan formed a Regional Reinvention Initiative Committee to plan for improving collaboration between Michigan's Regional Planning Agencies, Work Force Development Agencies, Adult Education Providers, Economic Development Agencies, and other agencies, and

WHEREAS, the Regional Prosperity Initiative is intending to foster greater communication and collaboration among organizations involved in economic development, education, work-force development, regional planning and transportation agencies, local and state government, and private business, and

WHEREAS, Western U.P. Planning and Development Region Commission will serve our six county area, and WHEREAS, only Western U.P. Planning and Development Region Commission is qualified to receive funding under the Regional Prosperity Initiative.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Keweenaw County Board of Commissioners hereby supports Western U.P. Planning and Development Region Commission as the grant applicant on behalf of the Western U.P. Michigan Prosperity Region. (#13-8)
